Deuteronomy 11:18–21. 18. Put these words of mine in your hearts and in your soul, and tie them on your wrists as signs and as symbols on your forehead. 19. Teach them to your children by talking about them when you sit in your house and when you travel on the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 20. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates, 21. so that your days and the days of your children may be many on the land that the LORD promised to your fathers with an oath, as many as the days that the heavens remain over the earth.




In Judaism, it is universally agreed on that verse 20 which says "write them (His Laws) on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates" is NOT to be taken metaphorically. All branches of Judaism interpret this verse as well as Deuteronomy 6:9 as being a command that is to be taken literally.

The tiny tube attached to the doorpost of a home that contains a parchment scroll with Biblical passages inscribed in it is called a mezuzah or mezuzot. The purpose of this device is to serve as a reminder to the worshiper to not forget God and His commandments.

Even some Christians have put their own twist on this idea by writing biblical verses on the posts of their houses during new

construction or a home remodel.

While these rituals and customs can serve a very good purpose, what is more important is that we understand who it is that has called us to be His own and live under Him in His kingdom.



It is our God that has done all of that. In love, God sent his son Jesus who came into this world to rescue the people of this world by doing what we could not do. Jesus, the sinless son of God lived a perfect life in our place

and then suffered and died to pay for our sins. His resurrection from the dead after 3 days is the proof that he accomplished his mission. The Holy Spirit working through God's Word, the Bible, created faith in our hearts that believes God's promises of forgiveness, peace and eternal life.

As your Pastor I encourage you to continue to place God's word at the center of your life as we live our lives as members of God's family.

For several years now we have been trying to find better ways of communicating to both our members and to our community what is going on at Our Savior's. Some of the funds will come from the Chris Meyer Trust which was set up to do projects such as this. The rest of the funds will come from donations that members have given or have indicated that they will be giving.

In our hymn "Hark the Voice of Jesus Crying" we sing," Let none hear you idly saying, 'There is nothing I can do,'while the multitudes are dying, and the Master calls for you."

We are praying that the new sign will be another tool as we continue to use all the means at our disposal to bring the precious Gospel to everyone we can. Our intention is to not just display the time of service - if that was all we are going to do we could have spent a lot less money. We are planning to advertise special events at church, sermon themes, Bible studies, etc.
